



Grant Q&A

Question: Can we apply for funding for an initiative that is already being funded by another source?

Response: If a proposal is selected for funding, the project lead will be required to sign a grant agreement that includes a statement that no other funding has been received for the proposal. The exception would be if the funding is a match to other funding that only partially funds the proposed work.

Question: Is there a minimum or maximum amount being funded?

Response: The maximum award requested is \$50,000 for a twelve-month period

Question: How many grants are being awarded?

Response: There is no set number of grants to be awarded

Question: Will this be a repeat or recurring grant?

Response: Immunize Wisconsin plans to release a request for proposals in late 2023

Question: Can funds be used to cover staff costs of vaccinating a high-risk group as long as the vaccine cost is not part of the RFP?

Response: The Immunize Wisconsin grant program is for a maximum of \$50,000 for twelve months and could be used to support programs to reach high-risk groups

Question: Are there restrictions on media campaigns?

Answer: There are no restrictions on proposals that include media campaigns

Question: Is there a limit on the number of partners?

Response: There is no limit to the number of partners included on a proposal as long as those partners are located in Wisconsin and support people living in Wisconsin

Question: Is there a limit on the incentives for vaccines?

Response: There are no restrictions on including incentives in a proposal

Question: Can funds be used to buy vaccines?

Response: No

Question: When will the funds be distributed?

Response: Funds will be distributed based on the proposed timeline/milestones and grant agreement. The earliest funds would be distributed would be February 2023

Question: Could we reimburse safety net clinics?



Response: Proposals must be for proposed work/initiatives and not for reimbursement of past work/initiatives

Question: Can staff coordination of events be reimbursed?

Response: Staff time needed to organize a proposed event can be included in the proposal budget

Question: What if there is a specific line item that is not eligible?

Response: Submitters are encouraged to reach out to Immunize Wisconsin if there is a question regarding budget item eligibility

Question: If we already have events happening can those be funded?

Response: This grant funding is intended for future events/initiatives and not for past work

Question: Elaborate on the organization's evaluation of impact measures.

Response: As part of the submitted proposal, there must be a description of how the team will assess the success of the proposed work. For example: if the proposal is to fund a spring health fair – attendance could be a measure used to assess the success of the event

Question: What has been funded before?

Response: This is the first RFP release for Immunize Wisconsin
